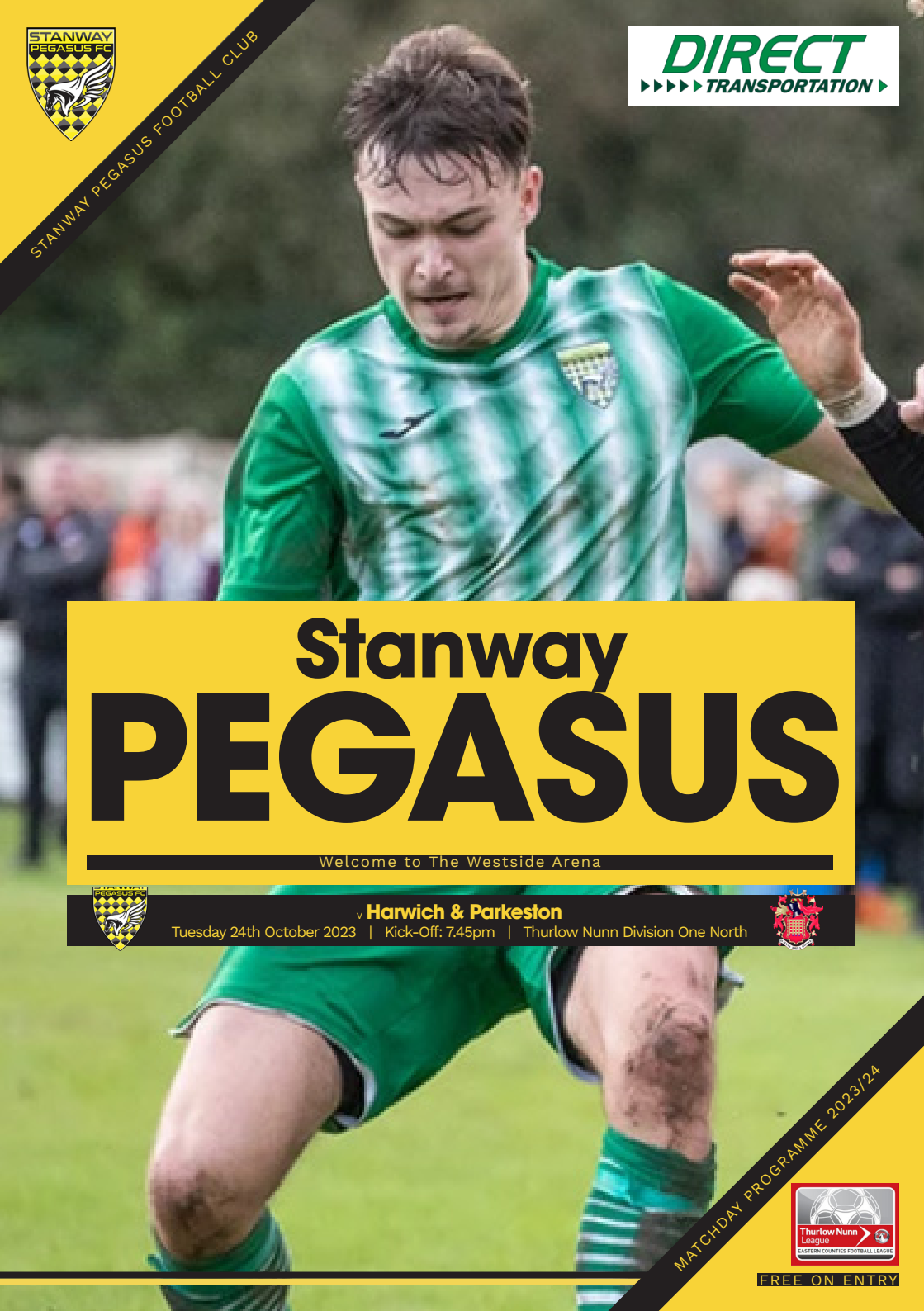

GROUND REGULATIONS

All persons entering the Stadium on match days are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations:

- 1) The Club reserves the right to eject from the ground and prosecute, if thought appropriate, any person within the clubs premises who is considered in breach of the following: **a)** Entering the ground by any means other than through the proper turnstiles or gates. **b)** Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. **c)** Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing likely to cause offence. **d)** Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise, that is likely to offend. **e)** Being drunk or being under the influence of drugs. **f)** Making vulgar or obscene gestures. **g)** Carrying any offensive object or throwing any article onto the field of play.
- 2) The Club reserves the right to refuse admission or eject from the ground any person who refuses to be searched by any servant or agent of the club or any Police Officer.
- 3) No glass bottles, drinking glasses or other such article or object is permitted in the ground and the Club Officials / Stewards will have the right to seize or confiscate any item or article considered to be a danger to others.
- 4) Climbing of the fences, stands and other structures including sitting on the barriers around the pitch is not permitted.
- 5) All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
- 6) Only players, officials and club personnel may enter the changing room area.
- 7) No Smoking or Alcohol allowed on school grounds.

fortunes, being twice relegated. After a season in the Athenian league they returned after 20 years absence to the eastern counties league.

The Essex senior trophy was lifted in 1990 and a year later reached the quarter final of the FA Vase. In 1996/97 they won the Essex counties league cup.

In 2003 Joe Royle, Ipswich town manager, and Jack Hayward, Essex county FA president, opened the new board room & dressing room facilities. Despite a late rally Harwich were relegated at the end of that season.

However, after a year the club regained their position in the Premier League. In 2004/05 a mid table position was achieved. The next season Harwich finished second from bottom but were spared relegation. Richard Elmes was appointed manager for the 2008/09 season but left in the October. Mark Morsley took over but left at the end of another disappointing season.

For the 2009/10 season Kevin Mather & Noel Gambling took the joint managerial position but resigned half way through the season when the playing budget was reduced; caretaker managers Mitchell Springett, Steve Jay & Tony Armstrong took over but in February 2010 the committee took the difficult decision to withdraw the first team from the Ridgions Premier League, due to lack of funds and one point from the season; the reserves continued and finished their season.

In 2010/11 season Harwich were playing in the Essex & Suffolk border league.

In 2017 Harwich & Parkeston were presented with a certificate by the pioneer's football clubs, certified by the FA., to say that it is officially recognised that their away match with Royal Antwerp in 1892 is the first match to be played between an English and European team.

The next few seasons were spent in the Essex & Suffolk Border League when they twice won the Border League Cup. Harwich returned to senior football in 2018; when they joined the Thurlow Nunn Eastern League Division 1 South. In 2022, they moved to the North Division.

Formed in 1877 the shrimpers reached their first cup final in 1891, losing to Clapton in the Essex senior cup.

In 1898 they moved to the Royal Oak ground where they have remained since. That season they also travelled to Middleborough to play in the amateur cup final, sadly losing to Stockton. However, they did win the Essex senior cup by beating Leytonstone. To mark the occasion the Harwich charity cup was formed which is still played for today.

Harwich joined the eastern counties league in 1935; during the 1930s they reached the 1st round proper of the FA Cup. "The Oak" saw a record attendance of 5,649 spectators in an amateur cup quarter final defeat against Romford in 1938.

A proud moment of the clubs history came in 1953 when Harwich played at Wembley stadium in front of a capacity 100,000 crowd, losing 6-0, against combined universities side Pegasus in the amateur cup final.

In 1964 Harwich joined the Athenian league, gaining promotion in two years to the premier division and by 1965 they had appeared in three more FA Cup 1st round proper ties against Headington, Crystal Palace and Torquay united.

In 1973 they switched to the isthmian league. In 1976/77 they again reached the 1st round proper of the FA Cup, losing to Enfield in a home replay.

The early 1980s saw a decline in Harwich's

Stanway Pegasus knock out higher-league Halstead Town out of the FA Vase via a penalty shootout after twice being pegged back

A season high crowd at the Milbank Stadium certainly got plenty of value for their admission price as Halstead Town went the distance with Stanway Pegasus before the latter lower-league side knocked them out of the Isuzu FA Vase in a tense penalty shootout.

The second-placed visiting Thurlow Nunn League First Division North side were competing in the national competition for the first time in their short history, having been founded off the back of a Sunday league side in 2018 while mid-table Halstead had been looking to progress to the second round for the first time in 14 years.

The fixture was one of only a handful of non-league games in the area which had survived the effects of Storm Babet with the volunteer groundstaff at the Milbank Stadium taking a round of applause ahead of kick-off in front of the bumper crowd.

The visitors were first to threaten with Jack Cherry getting a strong hand to divert Callum Griffith's angled shot past his far post as the rain lashed down. Up the other end Joe Older's shot was touched on by Kane Gilbert by it was not enough to trouble Felgate.

But it was Pegasus that got themselves into the lead in the fourth minute as the referee choose not to halt play after Jack McPherson took a fall in the area. After turning back inside Jack Shelvis and the full back got back on his feet to find Issa with a low cross and the he slammed it in back across Cherry's goal.

Halstead looked for a quick response but Alfie Cleal's shot on the turn was straight at Felgate. Sonny Dutton did execute a fine finish from Jake Brown's throughball in the 20th minute but the offside flag cut the celebrations short.

Sam Cripps passed up a decent opportunity to double the visitors' lead four minutes later when he headed over an unguarded net following a corner which had caught Cherry out but the Halstead shot-stopper made ammends when he rushed out to save at the feet of Cripps.

The home side went agonizingly close to an

equaliser when Bennett nodded Matt Coppen's low throw goalwards only to see a defender blocks it with his head before another knocked the looping rebound over his own crossbar.

The visitors were still looking dangerous on the counter and Cherry had to pull off a diving save to keep out Griffith's curling shot in he 27th minute.

His opposite number Felgate came to punch Dutton's deep free kick clear before Gilbert's diving header on an inch perfect Older cross to the far post somehow went wide.

But they were given a helping hand for the equaliser a minute later when Freddie Hayes upended Ade Funbi in the area with Gilbert sending the keeper the wrong way from the penalty spot.

The home side looked to use their momentum to get their noses in front before the break with Dutton's header from another long Coppen

throw held under his bar by Felgate while Cleal's low shot was too close to trouble him. Dutton fires over from an angled shot after being fed by Gilbert's tenacious play as the half ended all-square.

It was Pegasus that came out with their tails up after the break with Cherry rushing out to make a good save at the feet of Ager down the side of his area within two minutes of the restart, also getting up quickly to block the follow-up shot.

He was caught stranded a few minutes later after coming out to make another save but Bennett was on hand to head away Issa's deep shot, but they were undone by a stunning free kick in the 52nd minute with Ager firing in from 35 yards out into the top left-hand corner beyond the dive of Cherry.

It was not until the hour mark that the Humbugs fashioned their first chance of the half but Jordan Palmer's volley from a defensive header spun out for a throw-in.

Cleal had the crowd gasping soon after as his shot on the turn from just outside thundered just over the bar. Running across his marker at the near post, Funbi could not manage to steer Halstead substitute Harry Peakney's cross goalward.

In the 68th minute it was last-gasp defender which came to Halstead's aid as Benett made a lunging block to deny Griffiths' angled shot. Up the other end Gilbert fired down

the throat of Felgate after doing well to work his way in from the byline past Samir Rhaiti and Issa.

The latter found himself in a good position on the edge of Halstead's box son after with Cherry caught off his line, but curled his effort wide of the right-hand post. Cleal then made a good recovery run into the box to block Issa's shot after he again got free.

But Halstead drew level 12 minutes from time when centre-back Bennett found himself in the right place at the right time to smartly volley home a defensive header from a long punt forward by Cherry from just inside the area.

Chances continued at both ends as Plamer made a good block on Cripps' follow-up shot on the edge of the area before Pegasus' defence managed to hack clear a dangerous Older corner.

Bennett made a block from Griffith when the visitors broke dangerously as the clock ticked into stoppage time before Ager hit a wild

shot from a good position inside the area.

The visitors were adamant Shelvis should have been sent off for a tug back on Griffith just inside his own half as they broke from a Halstead corner with the referee only deeming it a yellow.

But the hosts were reduced to 10 men in the 96th minute when Gilbert was shown a second yellow for a debatable foul on Samir Rahiti.

With the inevitable shootout looming large, Halstead's management team brought on Matt Travell just ahead of the final whistle and although he tucked away their second penalty, the damage was done by Palmer's saved opener. The next 9 penalties all hit the net.

Griffith, Ager, Marangou, Issa scored the first four penalties for Pegasus and Jack McPherson ultimately held his nerve to make it five perfect penalties for the visitors and started the celebrations by whipping his shirt off and twirling it round his head as he ran towards the stand before being lost under a sea of green shirts.

Stanway Pegasus Football Club was derived from the most successful Sunday League side in Colchester history, AFC Pegasus, who won an incredible 64 honours over a period of 30 years with Paul and Heather Booth at the helm for every one of them.

AFC Pegasus in turn was created from Pegasus Youth in 1985 who had a great history in the Colchester Youth League for many years dating back to the early 1970's with the founder being Mr Peter Peters.

When Paul and Heather stepped aside a new era was about to begin and the transition from Sunday League to Saturday football for the senior team in 2018 opened the door for the return of the youth set up at the club.

With passion and drive to succeed than ever before, both off and on the pitch, we were ready to start that new era. With various youth and men's teams in full swing, our vision is to be one of the biggest clubs in Essex that has men's teams competing at a high level of non-league football who lead the way for the youth set-up. This youth set-up will progress through their age groups starting at U6's, all the way through to U18's.

This is what we call 'The Pathway'. Although player development is a key aspect of our philosophy, the aim for the youth is to enjoy playing football for Stanway Pegasus and looking at the talented home grown youth squads we have, boys and girls the future

is looking very good under the guidance of our Head of Youth Ray Turner.

The Club prides itself hugely on former and current players plus youth managers taking up major roles within the Club whilst surrounding ourselves with people we trust.

Soon to be added to the Pegasus family were the women, girls and recently the Vets as the club proudly sits at over 30 teams have been the fastest growing Club in the area and success is no stranger with many league titles and promotions along with cup success the Club is blossoming into a huge success story and long may it continue.

Senior football for the men's first team was secured for the first time at the end of the 2021 /22 season with the team gaining promotion from Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League where they went unbeaten winning the league with 98 points from 34 games scoring 126 goals in the process.

They also beat Tiptree Heath 1-0 in the League Cup Final at Little Oakley. Max Booth was the Division's top goal scorer with 34 (26 league and 8 Cup)

2022/23 Season saw the team in the Eastern Counties Division One South where we narrowly lost out on promotion at the first attempt via a penalty shoot out after a 2-2 draw against Sporting Bengal.

Although heartbreaking at the time looking back and what a

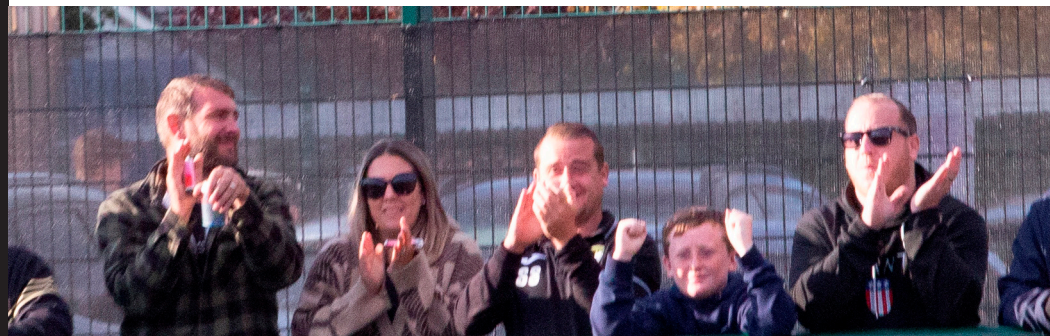
